



The Pilot Radio & Tube Corp. was famous throughout the world for its short wave kits in the late 20's. The demand for Pilot products overtaxed their Brooklyn, New York plant and new quarters were sought. Anticipating continued growth they moved into a new plant at Lawrence, Mass., claimed by Pilot to be the largest plant in the world owned and operated by a radio manufacturer. The main building was five blocks long and the factory contained one and a half million square feet of useable floor space. Almost all parts used in the manufacture of Pilot radios, except speakers, were made there.

Type 24 tubes are used in the 2 RF stages, along with another as the detector. This is followed by a resistance-capacity coupled type 27 tube in the 1st AF stage transformer coupled to a 45 tube in the final AF stage. Direct current is provided by an 80 rectifier tube.

In the early version, volume is controlled by a 50K ohm potentiometer varying voltage to the screen grids of the RF tubes. In the later version, a 4K ohm potentiometer controls antenna and cathode bias.

The chassis is one piece pressed aluminum. The 6 tubes are in a line along the back of the chassis. In the left front of the chassis is a 3 gang "Vaultype" tuning condenser. To the right is a power pack comprising the AF transformer, 1st choke, and 4 filter condensers. Underneath are "Twin-Coupler" RF coils, power transformer, and by-pass condenser block. A 6" Rola cone speaker is used with its tapped field coil acting as 2nd choke and part of the voltage divider system. A 110 volt direct current version was also available using four 01A and two 71A tubes.



PILOT MIDGET

The Pilot midget is not a commonly found set and its unusual styling make it a worthy collectable.

For the 1930-31 season, Pilot introduced their first factory assembled receiver, the Pilot "Midget", catalogue #S-155. It was a 6 tube tuned radio frequency set weighing 32 pounds housed in a cabinet of walnut veneer 17" wide, 8½" deep, and 17½" high. It retailed for \$59.50 less tubes.

COLLECTORS VALUE GUIDE

This "Value Guide" is an attempt to establish a relative value of many of the more common radios of the 1920's. The values expressed are the result of past market trends as indicated in recent auctions, flea market sales, sales by individual collectors, as well as information provided by other established collectors in the hobby. The factors affecting a value of a radio are many. One must consider the more obvious factors, such as condition of the radio, whether it is complete with tubes, in working condition, originality, age, rarity and etc. Other factors contributing to value include collector demand, collecting specialties (such as collecting wireless items, crystal sets, etc.), and geographic area. Thus when using this guide, you must consider these multitude of factors when valuating your radio. Of coarse the final value in the end, is the price another person is willing to pay for an item.

LETTERS FROM READERS: Question - I have a 2 piece Paramount receiver. The first box contains the tuner and detector stages with 2 large dials and a couple small ones. The second box has two stages of audio and both pieces roughly resemble the Paragon RA10 - DA2. 


MODEL V-The only difference between the late version "Ace" V and this Crosley Model V...is the name "Crosley" on the panel. The paper tag on the lid made no mention of "Ace" or "Precision". (Some arrangement must have been worked out over the Armstrong patent laws.) This set, somewhat condensed, would reappear later as Crosley's Model 50.



ACE MODEL V-In early 1923, Crosley purchased the Precision Equipment Co. to obtain their Armstrong patent. To comply with the law, Crosley had to market his regenerative receivers under Precision's trade name "Ace". Such was the case of this one-tube Model V. This early version had a push-pull drum type tapped coil, and wood book condenser, and all standard Crosley components. Note the Armstrong patent number engraved into the panel.



MODEL 1 - The Crosley Model 1 (one) was a completely renewed version of Crosley's first receiver, the tiny Harko Crystal Set. The new box and post matched-up with the Audion Detector, RFTA and 2-Step Audio Frequency Amplifier. Unlike the Harko, its detector was the Wireless Specialty "Tombstone" type. In 1923, it came complete with antenna wire, Crosley brand phones and insulators... all for \$25.



ACE MODEL V-This is the later version of Crosley's "Ace" regenerative Model V. One tube, two less taps on the coil, newer convex styled knobs for the tap switch and regeneration coil which was the new flat spiderweb type. Black molded material replaced the porcelain tube socket and wood book condenser plates.



WITH THE COLLECTORS



My antique radio collecting started in a negative sort of way in the early 1950's when my father tried to give me his first factory made set. It was a model 12 AK breadboard with Radiola UZ-1325 horn. Seeing that it didn't even have a cabinet and with that funny looking speaker, I laughed and said I did not want it. An old radio would have been ok but that, I thought at the time, was ridiculous. My dad stuck his treasure back up in the garage attic.

He had been very active in the early days of radio in Jamestown, N.Y. and was ready with his homebrew set when KDKA first came on the air in 1920. Later he began building broadcast sets for friends and to sell locally. Ultimately he developed a two tube reflex set with separate crystal detector which used the two tubes both as RF and audio amplifiers. I don't have one of these sets and, wonder if there are still any around Jamestown but I digress.

Along came the depression and my dad's hobby became his job. He began making and repairing sets full time. I guess that is how my interest started. Dad was very successful in the radio business and in a few years the entire house and garage were loaded with sets. I got used to living with radios around. In the early 40's I began working part time for him servicing radios while I was in high school. I was then learning what I need to know now to pursue the hobby of antique radio.

After World War II, I went to college. This culminated with a BS in electrical engineering from the University of Iowa followed by a job as electronic engineer at Bell Aerospace for the past 35 years. All of this background, I guess, made me a natural to enter the hobby of antique radio collecting. All that was still needed was the seed. The idea to start collecting. This happened about ten years ago when my wife, Dorothy, bought me an AK model 20 compact and horn for \$35 for Christmas.

In 1977, I talked Dick Schamberger into starting a local club which we now call the NFWA. This added the necessary impetus. Now my wife and I met others with the same disease. That was great! Dot learned that I was not the only nut with a basement full of old radio junk and that in fact the hobby of antique radio collecting was almost respectable. It became more of a family activity then. We searched the flea markets and antique stores together and she, and even my daughter, started helping at our local NFWA meets. Dot even attended the ARCA meet in Elgin last summer.

My collection, like most, has now grown to the point where I have no more room. To continue, therefore, I must now upgrade rather than add more. I particularly like Federal, Grebe, Kennedy, and RCA but also have many others. With the latest inventory, I find that I no longer have any three knob TRF sets except for the six AK breadboards. In Federals, I have all the early common ones including the model 57, 58, 59, 61, 100, Junior, and even the gold plated 161.


All the Kennedys fit into one show case. They include the model 110 and 220 both with 525 amplifiers, the 281 with 521 amp, a 20, a V, and a rare V portable in black leatherette case.

In Radiolas, I still need the VI. My Radiola IIIA is different. It is a floor model combination with split top. The radio is under one lid and a mechanical hand crank phonograph under the other. There is a valve to switch the horn bell on the front of the cabinet from phonograph to radio. The only other I ever saw was in the AWA Museum.

Finally let me tell you about my experience last night. I had gone out to look at a Wurlitzer radio when the dealer asked me if I was interested in wireless. Keeping a poker face I said yes. He produced a box of stuff including a DeForest RJ4 detector with spherical audion on the front panel. He said the price was \$25, but that I had to take the whole box! Wow did I ever!

Going back to my dad's AK model 12 breadboard, I am proud to say that I now have it in my collection. Antique radio collecting has been fun and gives me more to look forward to after I retire.


WITH THE COLLECTORS

Here is a way of testing many varieties of vintage tubes on modern emission type tube testers which provide no data for these tubes.

Through the use of the chart shown below and socket adaptors or clip leads, you should be able to test any of the following tubes on whatever tube tester you own or can borrow with as much assurance as would be possible if the tube were listed on the tester chart.

Because it is listed on virtually all but the newest tube testers, the type 30 tube has been used as a standard to which all other tubes are related. In other words, the percentage shown in Column 2 should be added to, or subtracted from (as indicated) your tester's chart settings for the type 30 tube. The tester meter should be read in the normal fashion.

Column 1 - the actual settings of the tube tester adjustment dial if this dial has a 0 - 100 scale. If it does not, make whatever changes would be necessary to convert to your own scale requirements. As an example, if your scale is 0 - 50, divide the numbers shown in Column 1 by 2. Column 2 - the same as Column 1 expressed as a percentage of difference from the standard setting for a type 30 tube. Column 3 - the filament voltage required for the tube under test. This should be set as accurately as possible usually with the "Line Voltage" adjustment knob of the tube tester and its "Filament Voltage" selector switch. Use a volt meter at a tube socket while the tube is in the tester. It is not necessary to measure at the socket where the tube is plugged in, since all sockets are usually fed simultaneously with the same voltage. Pick the filament pins of an adjacent socket to conveniently make the measurement. Column 4 - the base diagram for the tube under test.






